

The Uniting Church came about through 3 separate denominations choosing to join together, Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregationalist. To celebrate what the Uniting Church has become we are making a Uniting Church Trifle. You can use a plain option or go Chocolate roll and chocolate custard with berries depending on what you like, finish off with grated chocolate on top.

Recipe: Uniting Church Trifle



Ingredients:

- ~ 1 X Sponge roll
- ~ Tinned fruit
- ~ Fresh fruit optional
- ~ Custard
- ~ Chocolate

Method:

You can either serve in a big bowl or in individual dishes.

1. Slice the sponge roll and place a layer on the bottom of the bowl.
2. Place a fruit layer and some of the juice so it soaks into the cake.
3. Put a layer of custard on the top.
4. If you have room repeat the layers again.

Logo**



The UCA logo shows the cross of Jesus Christ, in its light and love, standing over a darkened world — redeeming it through grace and truth.

By that cross people are bound to Christ and each other. The Holy Spirit, symbolised by the dove with the wings of flame, empowers and guides us to be witnesses to Jesus Christ.

The wide U at the bottom points to the fact that we are uniting; as a semicircle it also reminds us that the renewing of both church and world are as yet incomplete.

The logo symbolises something of the vision we have glimpsed and the hopes we hold for the future. In particular it reminds us:

- that the gospel message is central in all that we seek to do;
- of the need for constant reform and renewal;
- of our commitment to worship, witness and service.
